



51st AWESNA CONVENTION REPORT

The 51st AWESNA Convention was held on September 3-5, 2021 at Double Tree Resort by Hilton Paradise Valley in Scottsdale, Arizona. The theme was “Resilience and Resolve”. The featured speaker was Pastor Dan Smith.

It was a long awaited convention because the 2020 convention was cancelled due to travel and social distancing restrictions due to Covid-19. The 2021 convention was planned and prepared with much analysis, checking news updates, safety protocols, faith and prayers due to the Delta Coronavirus strain was still active.

Scottsdale was a beautiful venue, literally warm at temperatures in the 100s and figuratively because of the warm welcome by the Arizona Chapter under the leadership of Pastor Ron Yabut and chapter members. The chapter was organized in 2019 under the leadership of Pastor Geof Tio who together with our Convention Chair, Annie Madigan secured the venue in 2020 but was postponed to 2021. Jesse Austria Role, PhD, Multimedia Communication Design Committee Chair, gave a workshop on "AWESNA Website Orientation and Development". In the afternoon, the House of Delegates met. "In Remembrance" a slide show honoring our alumni members that died in the past two years was presented. It was put together by Ramon "Bojo" Lijauco.
